



## Agnes Nash Malone

May 26, 1918 - January 17, 2008

Agnes Elizabeth Malone was born on May 26, 1918 to William Lee and Sallie Fay (Gray) Nash in Barton Chapel (Jack County), Texas. She passed away at her home in Jacksboro, Texas. She was 89 years old. She was raised in rural Jack County near Barton Chapel and attended school there until the age of 12 when she moved to Jacksboro with her father, mother and sister. She graduated from Jacksboro High School in 1936 and she attended Texas Women's University in Denton, Texas. She married James Alden "Al" Malone on November 13, 1938 in Fort Worth, Texas. They lived briefly in Santa Monica, California and Grand Prairie but in 1946 they returned to Jacksboro to operate Nash Hardware for the next 50 years. She was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Jacksboro as well. She is preceded in death by her parents; her husband James Alden Malone on April 14, 1998. She is survived by her son Douglas Rodney "Rod" Malone and his wife Wanda of Austin, Texas; her sister Dorothy Nell Cruz of Jacksboro; 3 grandchildren, 2 great-grandchildren and other family and friends. There will be a visitation on Saturday January 19, 2008 at Coker Funeral Home in Jacksboro from 7:00 to 8:00pm. Services will be Sunday January 20, 2008 at 2:00pm at First United Methodist Church in Jacksboro with burial to follow at Oakwood Cemetery in Jacksboro.
