Aldon James Nash was born on February 12, 1923 in Jack County, Texas to Floyd J. and Eva (Hardy) Nash. He passed away on Monday April 29, 2013 in Jacksboro, Texas. He was 90 years old.

Aldon married the late Emma Catherine (Turner) Nash on November 29, 1948. He was a cattle rancher and a lifelong resident of Jack County. He was a World War II Army Veteran serving for the 45th Infantry, 157th Regiment Company K. Aldon was also a director of Jack County Farm Bureau since 1963 serving as president many times. He was also the Chairman of the Jack County Republican Party since 1982, chairman of the Jack County Livestock Show for four years in the 1960's and a member and deacon of Live Oak Baptist Church. In addition to that he also was a member of the Lion's Club and the Jacksboro Chamber of Commerce. A loving husband and father who gave his time and love for his family and his community.

He is preceded in death by his wife, his parents and brother Herschel Nash and sisters Lola Bird and Zula Mason.

Aldon is survived today by his two daughters Eva May Nash of Lubbock, Texas and Brenda Nash of Buffalo Gap, Texas his grandchildren Melanie and Kirby Wigington and his great-grandchildren Kylee, Kaden, Kianna, Jacob and Jarrett and many other extended family members and friends.
