Doris Osteen was born on July 23, 1924 in Arkansas City, Arkansas and passed away on February 24, 2012. Her father was Fulton A. Rogers and her mother was Icy Estella Geeslin Rogers Sustaire. She is preceded in death by her parents as well as her brother, Joe Clyde Rogers, sister and brother-in-law, Aleene and Max Pool, step-father, W.R. Sustaire, step-brother, Bascom Sustaire, and step-sister, Lillian Pool. Reared around Greenwood, Texas, Doris graduated from Saltillo High School at the age of 16. She went on to Tyler Commercial College to become a secretary. About that time she won a blue ribbon at the Texas State Fair for typing 70 words a minute for 15 minutes with only 2 mistakes on an old manual typewriter. Later, she attended Southern Methodist University. Mrs. Osteen worked at Hartlee Field in Denton, Texas where glider pilots were trained during WWII, and later worked at the Pentagon in Washington, D.C. She was also the secretary to the general manager of Gothwaite's Toro Dealership in Ft. Worth, Texas for several years. She was a member and secretary at Calvary Baptist Church in Tyler, Texas for the next 23 years. Mrs. Osteen is survived by her son and daughter-in-law, Dale and Elaine Osteen, of Jacksboro, granddaughter, Amy Howell and her husband Barrett and daughter Micah, of Dallas, Texas, and grandson, Jeffrey Osteen, and his wife Toshie and daughter Alessandra of Yokohama, Japan; niece Linda Sikes and husband, Raymond of Tyler.
