August 1, 1916 - June 21, 2011

Jack S. Clarke, 94, of Waco died June 21, 2011. Services will be a graveside service at Oakwood Cemetery, Jacksboro, Texas. Mr. Clarke was born in Cushing, Oklahoma on August 1, 1916 to Charles and Nell Clarke, but he spent his childhood and young adult years in Ft. Worth, Texas. He married Verlie J. Kelley on Sept. 26, 1942 in Damascus, Ark. They lived in Wichita Falls, Texas for 16 years and College Station for 34 years before moving to Waco on July 1, 1996. He worked as an air traffic controller for the FAA for 34 years both at Shepard Air Force Base in Wichita Falls and in Bryan. At the age of 58 he went back to school at Texas A&M and earned an associates degree in Electrical Engineering, and then worked for A&M until the age of 70. He was a loving husband and father who faithfully cared for his wife for the 10 years she was in a nursing home. He was a member of Richfield Christian Church of Waco and formerly very active in First Christian Church of Wichita Falls and First Christian church of Bryan. He was preceded in death by parents, Charles and Nell Clarke, sister, Margaret Roberts, and daughter, Charlotte Ann Hackley. Survivors include daughter, Sandra Kay Westmoreland and husband, John, son-in-law, John Hackley of Jacksboro, four grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren, brothers Richard Clarke and wife Jean of Sun Lakes, Ariz. and Mack Clarke and wife Margie of Pearland, Texas along with numerous nieces and nephews.
