We remember many, many years ago when Clark and Thelma were ill, us going to visit them and Blaine being there. In those times he shared his concern for his parents, and also at these times his concern for your mother and taking her to Wichita Falls for treatments. There are many many experiences which come to mind which are too numerous to mention. One which I keep thinking of is his desire to help a lady with two children who came to town. She came to Live Oak one Sunday night and told us a big story about her past experience, which turned out to all be false. She was allowed to stay at the Resource Center the limited time, and then Blaine was compassionate and let her and the two children live in the mobile home which had been provided South of his home for family to use. Anyway, this lady misused his compassion and just took advantage of his goodness. There will be many rewards for him in heaven. I think many times of his wanting to continue to be independent and seeing him in the grocery store on his scooter putting groceries on the scooter, and then going to a grocery basket and putting them in a basket until he had all the items he had on his list to buy. These are small things to some, but to many they were a great influence.

We will be gone a few more weeks, but we did want you all to know that we care and want to express our feelings to all of you.
